The meeting was scheduled to identify topics for the April edition of Back Step Talks. We must keep our sights set on the mental health issues that exist in the first responder community and as leaders, we must take be able to recognize the signs of mental stress and direct our members (or ourselves) to resources when mental stress impacts family or work life.

Priority to scholarship awards will be given to individuals directly involved in mental health and awareness, especially on the topic of suicide. These people should be advocates on a county or state level, i.e., Chaplains, members of the LAST team, Mental Health Taskforce, Peer Support Team members, etc.

Reimbursement will cover air travel to Nashville, local transportation to/from the hotel, up to 3 nights of lodging, and conference registration fee.
